

Ina Bobelle "Bobbie" Harrell - Pioneer Inductee

Born in Wright and the 1940 Valedictorian of Fort Walton High School, Bobbie Harrell was a trailblazer for women. She was the first woman admitted to and the first female graduate of the Alabama Institute Polytechnic (later Auburn University) Pharmacy School. She was a Civil Air Patrol pilot from 1945-47, and received the Congressional Gold Medal for WWII CAP members. Bobbie became the practicing female pharmacist in first Okaloosa County in 1946, and later owned and operated her own drugstore with her Bobbie's record of scholastic spouse. leadership achievement and in her profession and community is a continuing source of inspiration for all.
